#### Middle School Goals

Our goal is to provide a challenging and developmentally appropriate program of studies that allows Middle School students to explore a wide variety of subjects, make connections to other disciplines and their daily lives, and mature into young adults.

To meet this goal, we are implementing several changes to our structures that will cater to the unique requirements of Middle School students and give them a new sense of identity, separate from their High School counterparts.

## Why make these changes?

Middle School students have very specific needs and are quite different from High School students in terms of their development and decision making. They are undergoing...

- Significant physical changes rapid growth, onset of puberty
- Significant changes in the brain developing of the part of the brain in charge of planning, reasoning, anticipating consequences, sustaining attention and making decisions.
- Significant intellectual growth development of metacognition, independent thought, abstract thought
- Moral development no longer accept adults moral judgement developing personal values

#### Successful Middle Schools

Exemplary middle level schools address the distinctiveness of early adolescence with various instructional and organizational features. Five key components are generally recognized by educators, associations, foundations, state boards of education, and researchers. (NMSA)

- 1. Interdisciplinary teaming Grade level teams working together to create transfer opportunities
- 2. Advisory programs An advocate for each child
- 3. Varied instruction collaboration, problem solving, groupings, projects, reading, performing...
- 4. Exploratory programs Band, Choir, Theatre, Visual Art, French, Spanish, Arabic, PE...
- 5. Transition programs MS Orientation Day for Grade 5, Soft Start for Grade 6, HS Orientation for Gr. 9

# Rationale Behind Integrated Math

- Seeing mathematics as a coherent whole
- Opportunities for connections across the units is enhanced in the integrated approach
- The IBDP Math curriculum also uses an integrated approach.
- All three courses in both pathways include the same content standards.
- Across the three courses, students in the traditional pathway study the same content as students in the integrated pathway.

Yes, we have adopted the Holt McDougal Integrated Mathematics Series and will have other resources to support implementation of the integrated pathway.


#### **Honors Classes**
